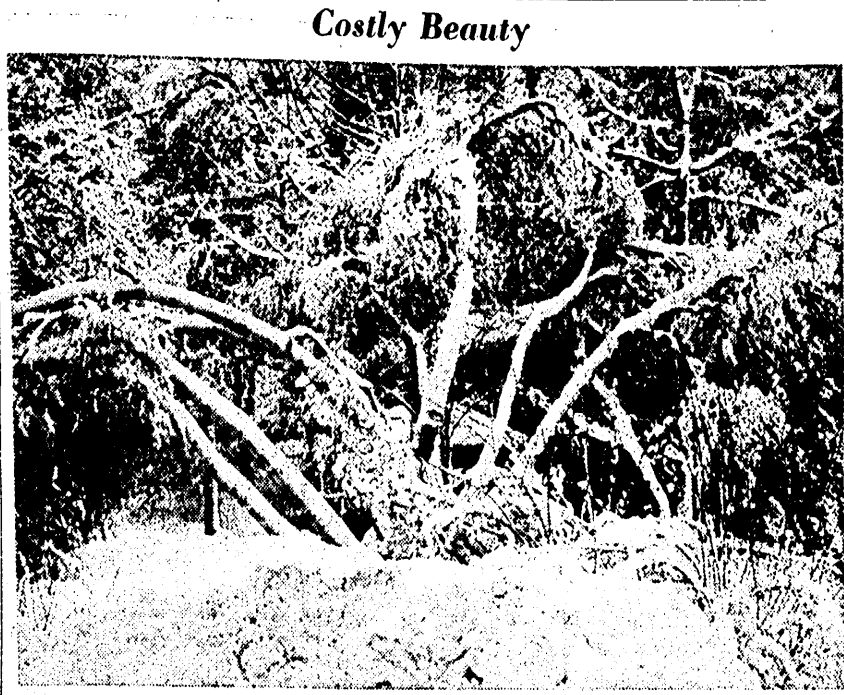


Company Names Board; Reviews Year

He did not elaborate. But the Republicans were accused by the Democrats of running a rough campaign on civil rights in the North in 1960, sparked by Vice

President Richard M. Nixon, and a soft campaign in the South with speeches by Sen. Barry Goldwater of Arizona.

(Continued from Page One) had been activated for test purposes in the previous checks, they will have to be replaced to insure peak performance.

Corrosion of Valves.

Further, there is a strong likelihood that the attitude control system operated by hydrogen peroxide jets, will have to be replaced. These jets were loaded two days ago, and the gas has a tendency to corrode the escape valves, which Glenn would use to maintain his position relative to the horizon while on his flight.

Beside the continuing bad weather downrange from here, a cold front moving down from the North was pushing a layer of broken clouds over the launching area at this space center.

This cloudy condition was expected to last through the weekend. It was such a cloud cover that was cited as the reason for the postponement of the launch attempt Jan. 27.
